WRITERFEST NASHVILLE UNITES CREATIVE WRITERS AT FIFTH CONFERENCE

Join writers of book, song, and screen Nov. 17-18 at Belmont University



NASHVILLE, TN. – WriterFest Nashville will kick-off its fifth annual conference Nov. 17-18 at Belmont University. An incredible two-day event designed for writers of book, song and film, it aims to inspire, empower and connect creatives. The weekend includes 11 expert panel sessions, five seminars and "Ask the Expert" one-on-one appointments, as well as a special fundraiser for Dolly Parton's Imagination Library at Love and Exile Winery and Bar.

Keynote speakers at 2023's conference are **Patti** Callahan Henry, a New York Times, EPCA, Globe

and Mail and USA Today bestselling author of 17 novels, including "The Secret Book of Flora Lea" and "Once Upon a Wardrobe"; **Tyler Merrit**t, Nashville-based actor, comedian, vocalist, creator of The Tyler Merritt Project and author of "I Take My Coffee Black: Reflections on Tupac, Musical Theater, Faith and Being Black in America"; and **Julia Whelan**, deemed "The Adele of Audiobooks" by The New York Times, a writer, actor and audiobook narrator of more than 500 titles. Whelan's "Thank You For Listening" was a Best of 2022 pick at Amazon, and her numerous awards include Audible's Narrator of the Year.

Past notable keynote speakers include songwriter **Tom Douglas**, member of the Nashville Hall of Fame and co-writer of the Paramount Plus show "Love, Tom"; **JT Ellison**, New York Times bestselling novelist and Emmy-award winning host of "A Word on Words"; and **Liane Moriarty**, New York Times bestselling novelist of "Big Little Lies."

Founded in 2018 by Ami McConnell, WriterFest was established as a creative gathering for aspiring writers, published authors, screenwriters, poets, songwriters, and entertainment industry professionals in Nashville. Attendees can enjoy keynote talks by the best writers in the business as well as in-depth sessions with professional editors, literary agents, filmmakers and music industry insiders.
